RESOLUTION TO RATIFY THE INITIATION OF LITIGATION TO COMPEL THE MAYOR TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF INDIVIDUALS TO FILL THE VACANT AND EXPIRED SEATS ON THE WILLIAMSPORT MUNICIPAL WATER AUTHORITY AND THE WILLIAMSPORT SANITARY AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, on or about March 26, 2019, the City Solicitor's Office, on behalf of City Council, filed a Mandamus Complaint in the Court of Common Pleas of Lycoming County, to compel the Mayor to make recommendations to City Council for individuals to be appointed to fill four vacant and/or expired seats on the WMWA and WSA boards;

WHEREAS, the City wishes to ratify the initiation of said Mandamus Complaint;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that City Council ratifies the initiation of the Mandamus Complaint to seek a writ of mandamus to require that the Mayor make recommendations to City Council on individuals to be appointed to fill four vacant/expired seats on the WMWA/WSA Board, and the appropriate City officers, employees, and solicitors are authorized to sign and file documents to implement the intent of this Resolution.

COMPLAINT IN MANDAMUS

AND NOW, COMES the City of Williamsport, by and through its City Council, who files this Complaint in Mandamus, and in support thereof avers as follows:

- Plaintiff City of Williamsport, by and through its City Council (the "City"), is a 1. city of the third class under Pennsylvania law, situated within Lycoming County, and has a mailing address of 245 West Fourth Street, Williamsport, Pennsylvania 17701.
- Defendant Gabriel J. Campana is sued in his official capacity as the duly elected 2. Mayor of the City of Williamsport, and is an adult individual with a mailing address of 245 West Fourth Street, Williamsport, Pennsylvania 17701.
- This mandamus action arises under the laws of the Commonwealth of 3. Pennsylvania and is appropriately before this Court pursuant to Rule of Civil Procedure 1091 et seq.
 - This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 42 Pa. C.S. § 931. 4.
 - Venue is appropriate pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Civil Procedure 1092(c). 5.

- 6. This action has been filed to compel the Mayor to fulfill his obligation to recommend appointments to fill the four (4) vacant seats on the boards of the Williamsport Municipal Water Authority and the Williamsport Sanitary Authority.
- 7. Specifically, the Williamsport Municipal Water Authority (the "WMWA") operates under the Pennsylvania Municipal Authorities Act ("MAA") and is under the direction of a 10-member Board.
- 8. The Williamsport Sanitary Authority (the "WSA") also operates under the MAA, and is under the direction of a 10-member Board.
 - 9. The 10 members of the WMWA also serve as the 10 members of the WSA.
- 10. Board members are recommended for appointment to the WMWA/WSA by the Mayor, and their appointments are subject to the advice and consent of City Council -- once appointed, a member serves a five-year term. See 53 Pa. C.S. § 5610(a)(1); see also City Administrative Code, § 123.01 (Mayor "shall appoint with the advice and consent of Council..."); Section 415 of the Optional Third Class City Charter Law (same).
- 11. "[W]henever a vacancy has occurred by reason of the expiration of the term of any member, the governing body shall appoint a member of the board for a term of five years from the date of expiration of the prior term to succeed the member whose term has expired."

 See 53 Pa. C.S. § 5610(a)(1).
- 12. The governing body of the WMWA/WSA is the City of Williamsport. See e.g. Reed v. Harrisburg City Council, 606 Pa. 117, 126 (2010).
- 13. The Mayor thus has a legal obligation to recommended appointees to fill vacancies on the WMWA/WSA Boards, the appointment of which is subject to the advice and consent of City Council.

14. The terms of four Board members have expired, as of the following dates:

William Ertel January, 2019
Steven Cappelli January, 2018
George Bierman January, 2018
Cindi Perry December, 2016

- 15. However, under the MAA, these members "hold office until their successors have been appointed, and may succeed themselves..." See 53 Pa. C.S. § 5610(d).
- 16. The Mayor has refused to perform his legal obligation to recommend the appointment of successors to fill the four vacant/expired Board seats.
- 17. Instead, the seats remain occupied by members whose terms have expired -- these individuals have not been reappointed.
- 18. Under the law, the City has the right and the obligation to participate in the appointment process relative to the appointment of members. However, it cannot exercise that right unless the Mayor first proposes potential appointees.
- 19. The City's sole remedy is to request that the Court issue a writ of mandamus commanding that the Mayor propose appointees to fill the four vacant/expired board seats.
 - 20. The City lacks an adequate remedy at law, and the City's right to relief is clear.

WHEREFORE, the City of Williamsport, by and through its City Council, requests that the Court command Mayor Gabriel Campana to promptly submit to City Council the names of prospective appointees to fill the four vacant/expired seats on the Boards of the Williamsport Municipal Water Authority and the Williamsport Sanitary Authority.
