TITLE

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTION FUND (MTF) GRANT THROUGH THE COMMONWEALTH FINANCING AUTHORITY (CFA), AND DESIGNATING THE MAYOR AND THE CITY CONTROLLER AS THE OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY AND CFA.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the City of Williamsport in Lycoming County hereby request a Multimodal Transportation Fund grant of \$1,482,367 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority to be used for the Williamsport Downtown Safety Improvements Project. This grant has a zero dollar match component from the recipient.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Applicant does hereby designate the Mayor, and City Controller, as the officials to execute all documents and agreements between the City of Williamsport and the Commonwealth Financing Authority to facilitate and assist in obtaining the requested grant.

Opinion of Probable Cost - Williamsport Downtown Safety Improvements

Campbell St (Third St to Fourth St):

Sidewalk:

- 2555 LF x (5' std Width) / 9 = 1401 SY 1401 SY @ \$115/SY = \$161,115
Curbing ; 2555 LF @ \$35/LF = \$90,000
ADA curb ramps - \$40,000

Lighting:

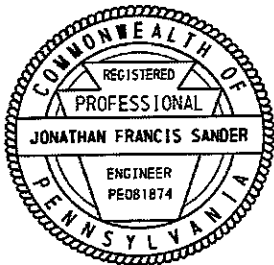
- 20 light posts & bases (same as the adjacent 3rd St project) @ \$5000/EA = \$100,000
Wire & Conduit (combined) @ \$3.50/LF * 2600 LF = \$9,100

Fourth St (Basin to Mulberry):

From the 2018/2019 MTF application for 4th St (Basin St to Penn St):
\$644,514 for 580 LF of 2 lane road -> 644514/580 = \$1111/LF of 2 lane road
For the 2 lane block of Fourth St, from Basin to Mulberry, 800 LF x \$1111/LF = \$888,800

Total (including 5% contingency and 10% design and Construction Inspection) = \$1,482,367
